

# BRAZILIAN VISA REQUIREMENTS

## Checklist

1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>✓ Valid passport for at least six months (the Consular Section of the Embassy reserves the right not to endorse soiled, damaged or defaced passports).</li></ul>	
2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>✓ 2 recent passport-sized (3x4 cm) photographs (Normal size) <i>The photo must be a full-face front view on a clear white background</i></li></ul>	
3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>✓ <b>Original</b> 6 month stamped personal Bank statements, payment slips and credit card statements are accepted as proof. <i>Company statement can used to boost the application.</i></li></ul>	
4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>✓ Genuine Certificate of vaccination (Yellow Fever)</li><li>✓ Letter from the business/Employer on a letter head, stamped and signed</li><li>✓ Certificate of incorporation/Registration, Memorandum of association or CR12</li></ul>	
5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>✓ Estimate processing time is 10 working days</li></ul>	
6	<p><b>PLEASE NOTE: IMPORTANT</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>✓ That the requirements listed above should not, in any way, be considered all inclusive. The Consular Section of the Brazilian Embassy in Nairobi reserves the right to request additional information and/or documentation when they are deemed necessary.</li><li>✓ That this Consular Section DOES NOT provide express or emergency visa services.</li><li>✓ When filling in the manifest please check DATE OF BIRTH, because this information MUST perfectly match those on your passport.</li><li>✓ Whenever applicable and according to the regulations, only ORIGINAL documents are acceptable; NO scans, NO emails, NO colorful copies, NO electronic signed document.</li><li>✓ That issuing or denying a visa is a sovereign act of Governments. It is a prerogative applied by every country and strengthened by international practice.</li></ul>
